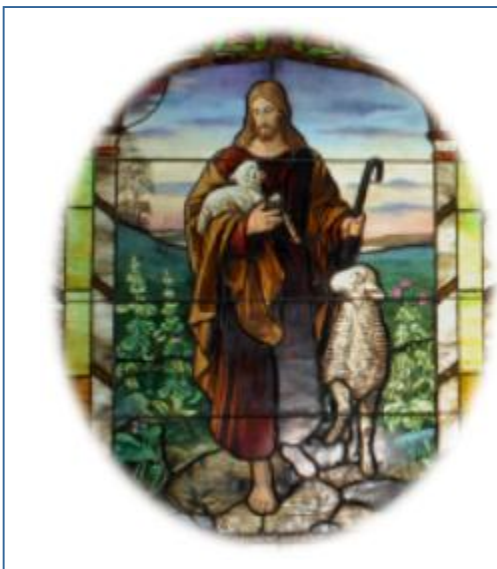

Holland-days...

Last week brought the first really warm weather of the season. Hopefully you were able to get out and enjoy God's creation. Not surprisingly the first significant thunder storms of the year were quick to follow on the heels of this heat. Sunday afternoon saw a real gully washer visit the valley. Later that same evening another one hit south of Billings that my daughter happened to be driving through. Then on Monday afternoon a much more severe one hit Denver right between the eyes. I know about the one in Denver because my son lives there. He posted pictures — of golf-ball sized hail held in his hand, and of the remnants of his garden, and of my car he had borrowed.

A few springs ago we read Psalm 29 responsively during the service and Jody McDevitt speculated it had been written during the midst of a thunderstorm. It bears repeating here, and this time I will use Eugene Peterson's version of the account:

*Bravo, God, bravo!
 Gods and all angels shout, "Encore!"
 In awe before the glory,
 in awe before God's visible power.
 Stand at attention!
 Dress your best to honor him!*

*God thunders across the waters,
 Brilliant, his voice and face, streaming brightness —
 God, across the flood waters.*

*God's thunder tympanic.
 God's thunder symphonic.*

*God's thunder smashes cedars,
 God topples the northern cedars.*

*The mountain ranges skip like spring colts,
 The high ridges jump like wild kid goats.*

*God's thunder spits fire.
 God thunders, the wilderness quakes;
 He makes the wilderness of Kadesh shake.*

*God's thunder sets the oak trees dancing
 A wild dance, whirling; the pelting rain strips their branches.
 We fall to our knees — we call out, "Glory!"*

*Above the floodwaters is God's throne
 from which his power flows
 from which he rules the world.*

*God makes his people strong.
 God gives his people peace.*
