Free Professional Fly Casting Workshops, 3 – 5 pm

Bill Toone, a Master Certified Fly Casting Instructor, who regularly worships with us, has offered to teach 2 sessions on the Rockhaven hillside. The workshops will accommodate beginners-intermediates. Bring your own equipment, or use Bill's. This is an exceptional opportunity to learn from a pro, who teaches for Yellowstone Fly Fishing School. Session One will begin at 3 pm; session 2 at 4 pm. Up to 10 people can participate each hour, although those who start at 3 pm can continue to practice in the second hour. This is a casting-only, on-land workshop—no license required. If you plan to fish, be sure you have a Montana license. *Class size is limited, and signups are required* to ensure that the needed equipment is there. Vespers with the Presby Cats and Riverside Singers – 7 pm in the Chapel


