


Co-Pastors' Corner... Often, summer is a "down" time for church life.

People go on vacations, as they should. Sunday school takes a summer break. The choir sits in the pews instead of the choir loft. Guest ministers fill the pulpit as ministers take vacation. The session rests. Church activity pauses, a "sabbath" in the calendar year.

One of the gifts of sabbath is the opportunity for rejuvenation, and this summer provided that for our church session. An idea voiced in the late spring, "What if we devote a season to exploring God's call?" took root in the session, and the Spirit nurtured this idea all summer long. When we kick off the fall on September 10 this year, we hope the entire congregation will be paying attention! For we are embarking on a "Year of Call," gathering all aspects of congregational life to examine, discover, and nurture the many ways God calls us.

On "Year of Call Kickoff Sunday," September 10, we will have a special guest speaker in the pulpit. Dr. David Henderson is assistant professor of educational leadership at Montana State University. He won't, however, be here to lecture us, but rather to invite us on a journey to examine our hearts, listen to our stories, and become the persons God is calling us to be. Dr. Henderson leads teachers in graduate programs to discover a more authentic, meaningful, and resilient life in which their inner life is aligned with their outer work in the world. His wisdom and expertise will help us begin our year's exploration. He is affiliated with the Center for Courage & Renewal founded by Parker Palmer, an organization which integrates education, community, leadership, spirituality, and social change.



Listening to Dr. Henderson will be just the start—you will be invited on your own discovery of call in your life this year. Please make an extra effort to be in worship on September 10 to inaugurate this special year!

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!!!

On September 11 there will be a training session at our church in room 204 for anyone interested in becoming a Family Promise volunteer.



It will be from 6:30-8:30 and that is the only requirement prior to becoming a volunteer host. As an evening host you would have an opportunity to eat a meal and visit with the Family Promise guests. Food is provided by members of our congregation. The time frame for this hosting is 5:15- 8:30. Those who agree to be overnight hosts arrive at 8:30, sleep on comfortable air mattresses in a classroom, then leave by 7:30 the next morning. This happens to be the easiest hosting but the area where we need more volunteers. We host Family Promise 4-5 separate weeks a year and are fortunate to be partnered with the LDS Church whose members take responsibility for Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of each of our hosting weeks.

Our church could not participate in this worthwhile community program without our faithful volunteers, but some people are no longer able to help or have moved to other congregations. Consequently, we are in need of more trained volunteers who can serve as hosts when it fits in their schedules.

LEARNING – Find out about what happened in our summer ministries, as well as what's planned for the fall.




Cardboard Box City is September 23

Join us at 5:30 for a spaghetti dinner - movie – popcorn – and ice cream for dessert as we discuss the implications in our lives from a Christian viewpoint of the movie for the month, **The Zookeepers Wife**. What is a hero? What influence do Christian values have in determining our actions? The author Diane Ackerman states, “We tend to think of heroes only in terms of violent combat...but human beings also perform radical acts of compassion... Antonina’s story needs to be told, because it’s a tale of the heroic compassion that so called ‘ordinary people’ rise to, in every era.” This movie is from a historical non-fiction novel of events occurring during the Holocaust. The Zabinskis were recognized for their righteous acts and defiant acts in risking their lives to save hundreds of Jews.

Help Wanted (Needed!)


Looking for a way to serve in the church? We are in need of help with Sunday School. Before you stop reading right here, you should know a couple of important things:



Women's Morning Book Group September 7



Longing for a world filled with peace and reconciliation, I gaze into the mirror and stumble upon the realization I am the one to blame. Me. The center of my very own universe — or at the very least the center of my own solar system around which all of my thoughts and actions rotate. The visage staring back at me in the mirror seems nonplussed at this revelation. The old, familiar face neither laughs nor cries. It just is.

Obviously there are a lot of me's out there. The world longed for peace and reconciliation before I became an official member and I assume it will continue doing so after I escape its gravitational pull. But just because someone jumps off the Brooklyn Bridge doesn't mean I have the moral justification to follow suit. And so it is that those mirror eyes cut a laser hole in the part of me I can't see in my reflection. My soul.

Very truly I say unto myself, this is the day for change. Today is the day of reckoning. But I also know I've had this pep talk before, and despite having read the story of Peter's denial a thousand times in the past, I always manage to stab my Master in the back within minutes of being reminded. It is disheartening to be so confident of my own predictable shortcomings. What can I do? And then a still, small voice responds. The answer does not come from the other side of the mirror. The voice is close yet it is far away and it tells me this: What I can do is what I can do.

Each new day dawns with an opportunity to do what I can do. Will this be the day when I no longer stand idly by as a longtime friend casually drops the n-word into a conversation? Will this be the day when I respond by being something other than uncomfortable when I am told a racist joke? Will this be the day when a shrug of my shoulders is no longer an appropriate response to a news report I hear of calamity striking a half a world away? Or a half a country away? Or a half a county away? Will this be the day?
