Congregational meeting called for Sunday, September 17

The session has called a special meeting of the congregation to be held in the sanctuary on Sunday, September 17, immediately following the 10:30 service. The nominating committee will be presenting a slate of nominees for election as deacons.

Deacons send aid to Seeley Lake

In the midst of a long and widespread fire season, our church's Board of Deacons felt called at its September 7 meeting to respond. "How can we help? Where is help most needed?" Within a day, we had an answer. The community of Seeley Lake has been filled with smoke, often hazardous, for most of the last 7 weeks. With emergency shelter and food provided by agencies such as the Red Cross and Montana Food Bank Network, Mountain Lakes Presbyterian Church in Seeley Lake has been working with local health agencies and the senior center to provide HEPA air filters to the most vulnerable in the community who could not otherwise afford them. Elderly persons, infants, young children, and those with heart and/or respiratory conditions are being identified and provided with air filters by the church.



The Deacons authorized \$1000 from the Emergency Assistance budget to be sent to the church for this mission.


Presby Cats are up and running again

God of relief,

Choked by smoke and with problems of our own we watch as disaster piles upon disaster. We feel helpless and hopeless as we watch images of lives lost and lives disrupted by forces we are powerless to stop.

But we can help. We can hope. We do have power.

The same technology that brings those images to our fingertips allows us to provide assistance where it is critically needed. We may not be boots on the ground, but boots cost money and that is something we do have. Even texting ten bucks can help. Ten bucks buys a lot of bottled water, which can mean everything to someone who is deluged with water without a drop of it to drink. And our money can buy food. The Houston Food Bank is dispensing a million pounds of food a day. A million pounds. Of food, A day.

Hope requires no technology. It is hardwired into our souls, but it does require some effort. We must come before your throne, dear Lord, and ask. We kneel in your presence and lift up someone we don't know in Galveston, or Key West, or Oaxaca, or St. Martin and plead that help will find them. It is our hope that there will be an intersection between the despair they are feeling and the relief our help is meant to provide.

The forces of nature possess a power beyond our comprehension, yet you instill in us, sweet Lord, the power to respond. This power is represented in the army of utility workers mobilized across the entire continent and headed down to restore electricity in the southeast. This power is demonstrated when a football player in Texas raises thirty million dollars in a week. This power is flexed when warships are transformed into instruments of relief.

You are faithful, dear God. You hear our prayers. You hear all of our prayers, and even as our hearts are drawn so far away, we know that rain is coming to our region. Thank you.
