#### **Cardboard Box City September 23-24**

Sleep in a box outside to raise funds for Family Promise? Some fearless Presbyterians have made this commitment!

Family Promise provides shelter and opportunities for homeless families. Our church is a host congregation, providing a home for up to 3 families for a week at a time, 4 times per year. These families receive



help addressing the causes of their homelessness while they work to improve their situations and get a fresh start.

The Cardboard Box City is this weekend, September 23-24, at Bogert Park. Participants will have a much more enjoyable evening than most homeless people do. There will be food, entertainment, and an opportunity to learn about homelessness by playing "The Game of Life." The pavilion will provide shelter, and the cardboard box homes will likely have warm sleeping bags, pillows, and even sleeping pads.
