Year of Call Spurs Small Groups to Form

One of the fruits of the "Called to Life" course which was offered in the fall is an interest in more opportunities to share more deeply in one another's lives, encouraging and supporting spiritual growth. While we have numerous groupings of people who are dedicated to particular ministries and through those shared interests, have become supportive small groups, we recognize a desire for more. The Year of Call task group is responding by providing an organizing framework for launching new small groups.

The goal of small groups in our church is "to create environments where Spirit-driven, life-giving experiences can flourish." (words of writer John Ortberg) The ministry is undertaken to ensure members and attendees at FPC are able to experience a sense of community that feeds their hunger for spiritual community.

Are you interested? Would you like to give this a try? In the next few weeks, you have an opportunity to sign up for one of these small groups. So far, the following opportunities have been identified. In all cases, the groups are open to all ages and genders, singles or couples. The initial commitment will be for 6-8 gatherings of each group, and each group will determine its parameters and agenda for discussion.

- 1. 7 am on Monday mornings, at Perkins Restaurant. Hosted by John Patterson, this group will open up and expand a small group which began in 1982. The group meets for 1 hour weekly.
- 2. A weeknight gathering at the home of Brent and Rachel Turner, probably bimonthly. The group will set its schedule as it forms.
- 3. A weekday gathering hosted by Gail Weingart. The group will set its schedule as it forms.

Another group at another time or place, hosted by you? Speak to Kelly Meredith, Brent Turner, John Patterson, Jody McDevitt, or Dan Krebill!



Contemporary Religious Issues Forum


