

Holland-days...

Last September 10th our congregation embarked on a year-long exploration of the theme, *Called to Life*. There are only a few more weeks remaining in this journey, because the term 'year-long' refers more to a school year than a calendar year. Still, for nearly nine months this theme has permeated much of our church based activity. So if we are living a healthy, examined life, we should ask ourselves if this experience has changed us.

I suspect for some of us the answer is yes. Some of us not only have heard a call, but have answered it. Perhaps it was to respond to a specific task, to fill a particular vacancy, or to step outside of our comfort zone and try something new. In my case it was answering the call for children's Sunday School teachers. In your case it might have been answering a totally different call.

In any case, I got to thinking about all this when I stumbled across an article in the latest issue of *Presbyterians Today*. The article was entitled *Death Café* and it recounts a movement I had previously been unfamiliar with. It is actually less a movement and more a loosely knit bunch of discussion groups throughout the country that get together to discuss, well, death. And life. And most anything in between. It sounded somewhat intriguing, but it also got me to thinking about something Dr. David Henderson told us about back on September 10th. In his opening address to us as we started this Year of Call, David used a paraphrase of an old G.K. Chesterton quote: "We now have a strong desire for living combined with a strange carelessness about dying. We desire life like water and yet are ready to drink death like wine."

I don't know if I am there yet — at least not the second part. I desire life like water, but I don't know if I am ready to drink death like wine. Perhaps that is because I have not yet completed the rest of the journey Dr. Henderson described. I have not embraced the sixteen inch trip I need to take from my head to my heart. That is where Jesus is calling me to go.
