God of relief,

Bad winds are blowing, Lord — winds from the bowels of wherever bad things emanate. And we watch in horror, helpless, as regular folks, people like you and me, are burned to death in their cars trying to escape this tsunami of flame that decimated an entire community in the blink of an eye.

The numbers are staggering, precious Lord. At first there was ten, then twenty, then thirty, now forty people have perished, and there's still more unaccounted for. And even if they survived there's nothing to go back to, thousands upon thousands of homes are reduced to smoldering piles of ash.

Homes, Lord, the very places where we fragile humans feel the safest — our sanctuaries — have been transformed into columbariums, sacred now because of the ashes and memories the wind continues to stir.

Oh Lord, help those people, and help us to help them. Until last week I had never heard of Paradise, California, and now paradise is truly lost. And it's not like Paradise suffers alone; it is but one of dozens of active fires up and down the coast. And it's not like this year is an anomaly. Every year it seems like we hear of a new community buried in grief. So while we pray in earnest for Malibu, Thousand Oaks, and Butte County, we can't forget Santa Rosa and others that are just now putting their lives back together and are reminded of the horror when that same wind blows through their rebuilding communities.

And Lord, give strength to the responders. There are thousands of them on the front lines, witnesses to the carnage and devastation. May they also bear witness to your mercy.
