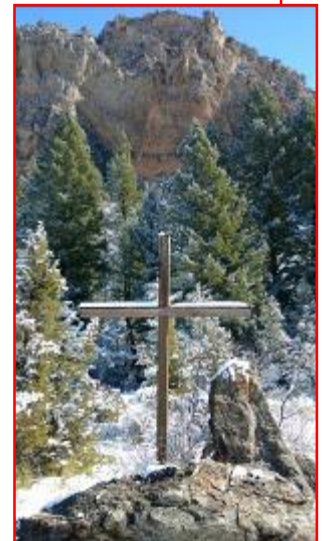
If you will be bringing children, please call the church office to arrange for a sitter and allow us to provide appropriate movies for the younger set.

There is no gift more precious than making a difference in the life of a child. Thrive partners with Bozeman Public Schools to match students in grades K-12 with an adult mentor. The students meet with their mentor once a week for an hour during the school day. Mentors provide academic support, enrichment or a supportive friendship. Some mentor relationships last a couple of years, others may continue through graduation. The CAP mentor program has been impacting students and mentors for 30 years; 600 mentor relationships happen every school year.
