#### Downtown Bozeman Palm Parade

This Sunday morning, April 14, the churches of downtown Bozeman will join in the second annual Palm Sunday Parade. This outdoor festivity brings all ages from six different churches together to celebrate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Each church supplies its own palms and people. Together, we will sing and parade in a public witness to our faith. As last year, a donkey will be part of the celebration.

Instructions: Gather in the parking lot at Holy Rosary Church to begin walking at 9:45 am. The sidewalk parade will go east on Main St., south on Tracy, then west on Olive St. Presbyterians can drop out of the parade at Willson and head to First Presbyterian Church for the 10:30 service, or to their cars if they worshiped at 8:30 am. On April 18, Maundy Thursday, we will celebrate with an agape feast and worship combined with a delicious chicken meal. We will begin at 6 pm with dinner, program and worship combined. #### Trail of Fears (Part VI)

Raul stared out of the slightly chipped window of the bus he had been sitting in for the past ten hours. The dark film on the outside of the window was peeling and a tiny piece of it flapped somewhat annoyingly in the wind resistance created by the bus's northwestward movement, but Raul barely noticed it. Instead his gaze fell upon the mountain range rising on the western horizon. When *la caravana* first left Mexico City the mountains had been all around them, but as the bus traveled north a plateau emerged separating the eastern branch from those on the west. As the topography became slightly more arid, the eastern range disappeared from view and now only the western range was visible.

Raul did not know these were the Sierra Madre Mountains, nor did he know they were the southern part of the backbone of North America and that he could follow them all the way to the farthest reaches of Canada. All he knew was they reminded him in this moment of the hills he would stare at from his bedroom window back home in El Salvador. Carmella stirred slightly in the seat next to him, but her light snoring continued after she buried her head a little deeper into Raul's shoulder. She hadn't vomited for a couple hours, but the sweet smell emanating from the plastic bag at their feet was a constant reminder of her struggles with motion sickness and the life growing in her womb.

For a moment Raul's thoughts turned back to the worship service in Mexico City last week. As the woman had washed their feet, Raul recalled the wonder he'd felt stirring in his soul; how, in the act of being served, of being loved, he then felt the need to serve, the need to love.

The bus hissed to a stop for the first time in nearly four hours. The migrants, though orderly and polite, were anxious to stretch their legs so wasted little time in exiting onto the midday street of the small town in northern Durango, just south of the border with Chihuahua. *La caravana* had discovered each Mexican state was anxious to expedite the migrants' passage through their state and had provided transportation at each border. Raul's group would board another bus in a couple hours to continue northwest toward Tijuana.

Carmella tugged on Raul's sleeve and motioned in the direction of the cobblestoned square in the center of the town where a few booths of what appeared to be a farmer's market were being set up. "Let's explore," she begged. Raul shrugged and lightly held Carmella's elbow as she waddled toward the market.

The first booth displayed a pile of fruit that Raul guessed were apricots as well as some soaps and cheeses. "How much?" he asked the kindly old couple sitting behind the table. As they replied, Raul just smiled knowing whatever the price it was a luxury he couldn't afford.
