- We received a beautiful stained glass donation from Paul and Doris Krebill that will be hung in the middle window of the fellowship hall. We are so grateful to Paul for sharing this special piece of artwork with us.
- It was noted that the assessments for 24 S. Willson have been received and a special thank you goes to Donna Beck for her work on getting half the lot separated so that we are only paying taxes on the one part. The assessments values increased to \$978,000 for the building and land and \$1,200,000 on the bare lot.
- The co-pastors reported on their work in the past month and comment on the mission trips still upcoming. They will be vacationing in the Beartooth Mts. this week an then have more vacation in August. Stephen Hundley and Doug Melius will be filling the pulpit when they are gone.
- Session approved funds from the mission support fund to help fund Dan and Jody's study leave trip to the Holy Lands in the Spring of 2020. They will use this as well as study leave to fund this time of learning about the Holy Land as well as spending five days studying the Palestine issue.
- We also approved funding for Kari Robbins for seminary. She will be meeting with the session on August 12 and the Presbytery on August 13 to come under the care of the Presbytery for her time at Seminary. More information will be forthcoming after those approvals are received as to how members can help support her in her education. To Mars and Beyond! VBS Wrapup

This year's Downtown Ecumenical Vacation Bible School was the biggest—and best? -VBŚ ever!

Here are the numbers:

161 children, nursery – 6th grade 60 youth volunteers, including 16 from a visiting church in Colorado Springs 97 adult volunteers, including 6 from Colorado Springs

Each year VBS chooses a mission project. This year the project was to provide donations to the Juliana Fund of Family Promise. This fund was established in memory of a young girl who was part of a Family Promise family when she died tragically while hiking with her family. The fund enables kids to participate in enriching activities which have fees, such as soccer, swimming lessons, dance classes, etc. With pennies, nickels, dimes, guarters, and lots of dollar bills, we raised \$2146.89!

There are additional numbers, such as 175 carpentry bookshelf kits assembled, and over 300 hotdogs and veggie burgers eaten at the closing (indoor) picnic. But the most important results of VBS can't be counted. A week of learning and living faith, boldness, kindness, thankfulness, and hope—new friends and more friends—the partnership of six churches—youth growing in leadership and faith—children growing in understanding of God—adults learning from kids—VBS is memorable and amazing.

Glory to God, who is able to do far beyond all that we can ask or imagine by the power at work within us! (Ephesians 3:20)

Holland-days...

This month (July 20th to be precise) marks the fiftieth anniversary of human's first steps on a cosmic body other than our own. The most recent edition of National Geographic has devoted most of its pages to commemorating this historic event. Included in its coverage is a discussion of the various things that have made the trip to the lunar surface — some of which returned to earth (Alan Shephard's golf club) and others of which remained behind (the golf balls Shephard hit as well as a family photo left behind by Charles Duke.) One item mentioned caught me by surprise, perhaps because I was in junior high at the time and didn't really think about the importance of those kinds of things at that age. In any event it was a photograph of the chalice Buzz Aldrin used during that initial voyage to celebrate the Lord's Supper on the moon. The chalice is now housed at a church near Houston and it got me to thinking what that most unusual of communions must have been like.

A Really Thin Place

The words of the Psalmist take on a whole new perspective:

O Lord, our Sovereign, how majestic is your name in all the earth...

...but for the first time the earth is just a blue marble illuminated against a backdrop of blackness.

This is my body, broken for you.

And how about these words:

When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers...

...and now we stand in those heavens and claim dominion where none have gone before.

This cup is the new covenant in my blood.

What are human beings that you are mindful of them...

...yet in the vastness of this unbound cosmos you reach down and love each one, even me.

For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes again.
