Holland-days...

During this past week the number of COVID-19 related deaths in Montana surpassed the number of traffic related fatalities in the state since the beginning of the year. This macabre statistic serves as a harsh reminder that we are far from putting the pandemic behind us. Last week also saw the state's number of positive cases reach the 9,000 plateau, but that still doesn't even represent 1% of our population. So as our skies continue to darken as a result of the worst and most far-reaching fire season the West has ever witnessed, we are left asking ourselves, how can we cope, how can we do the things we would normally be doing?

In our worship service on Sunday, we saw evidence of a few things we normally do, but had been absent during the last six months. The sanctuary welcomed the Bell Choir into its friendly confines, and we were able to watch two baptisms performed at Rockhaven. These are big steps in our return to normalcy and provide a great sense of assurance that our community of faith can not only endure but can thrive.

I have to confess I did not watch the service on Sunday at 9:30. I watched a later recording of it, because we were out of town — we were in Colorado attending our son's wedding.

Although some large, elaborate weddings have taken place in different parts of the country, some of those very ceremonies have become super-spreader events. As a result our son and daughter-in-law made the decision to significantly reduce the attendance at their blessed event. There were only a dozen of us gathered on the farm where our son works at the base of the Rocky Mountain Front. We all wore masks and were separated into family pods, as we had all come from different parts of the country.

You may recall that earlier last week a cold front brought snow to the intermountain west and the snow not only adorned the magnificent mountains that served as a backdrop to the ceremony, but it also put a damper on the huge fire that had been burning just west of our location. As a result the day of the wedding was blessed with crystal clear skies as we celebrated the formation of a new family.

Would the ceremony have been made more spectacular with another hundred-and-forty witnesses on hand? I have no doubt it would have been, but by the same token there was an intimacy present in this more modest affair that may prove to be more memorable than any extravagant event. In any case, everyone there knew everyone else that was present. How often does that happen at a wedding?
