#### Pandemic Response Team Report by John Patterson

We had some great worship services on Christmas Eve and for the Blessing of the Animals and we want to thank everyone who participated! The children did a tremendous job for the Christmas Eve service and our pets all seemed to get along for the Blessing of the Animals. Baroque Music Montana's "Heigh-Ho Holiday Concert," using our sanctuary with a small number of participants who followed our Covid-19 protocols, went well and we have been blessed to be able to use some of that music in our worship services. We are in discussion with them about additional programming.

After some time off during the Christmas and New Year holidays, the PRT is meeting again on Monday afternoons and as needed on Wednesday afternoons at 4 p.m. You are all welcome to join us anytime. We definitely value your opinions and input and would welcome your involvement if you would like to consider becoming a member of the PRT. You can contact any of us on the PRT for the Zoom link for our meetings.

As you are aware the number of new Covid-19 cases in the county, the percent of positive Covid-19 tests and the number of people hospitalized with Covid-19 remain high. And there is the wild-card of what will happen to the number of Covid-19 cases as MSU students return to campus. We know there are some church members who would very much like us to reopen to in-person worship. However, it's because of all of those factors I just listed that the PRT doesn't feel we should do that yet as we consider the safety not only of our congregation but of the broader community as well. We're hopeful that the Covid-19 vaccines will help us be able to get back to in-person worship.

As we move into 2021, we encourage you to remain connected with one another through our worship, study and fellowship opportunities as well as individual contact with one another. If you are feeling isolated or lonely, reach out to others in the church family. We're here for one another. That's part of being family.


#### Full Disclosure
