Holland-days...

Ouch. The pandemic took a turn this week — and it wasn't for the better. Worldwide there were 3.7 million positive cases during the last seven days, the most since mid-May. The trend within our nation showed a similar uptick as positive case counts last week exceeded 200,000 for the first time in two months. Even the county-wide tally of 36 last week represents the highest weekly total in the past six weeks.

Nine weeks ago this space reported that the world had just surpassed 1.5 billion vaccine jabs. Today that total stands at 3.6 billion, or an average of 33 million doses per day. Sadly very few of those are being administered within our borders as our vaccine curve has nearly flattened out. Sadder still is the fact that our northern neighbors, Canada, just surpassed the US in terms of percentage of eligible citizens getting vaccinated. Just as our own church sanctuary re-instituted health and safety protocols for Sunday worship, it appears many locales will now be headed back towards distancing and masking requirements.

There were no protocols in place for the Vesper service at Rockhaven this past Sunday, although it wasn't difficult to maintain distance as there were only seven people in attendance. The seven included Scott Thrasher, who led the service in his own unique style. Part of that uniqueness was where Scott decided to hold the service to beat the hundred degree heat. Throughout this summer camping season Scott has been holding the daily worship time in a shaded grove of junipers and fir trees tucked away on the other side of the river. He figured if the space was suitable to help young campers avoid the heat, then it would also do likewise for we older folks. He was right, and between the shade and a slight breeze it seemed ten degrees cooler than out in the meadow. This secluded spot was also more suitable for the message Scott delivered, namely how we are part of creation.

Scott's words have been churning within me for the past couple of days. Too often I am guilty of thinking that nature is out there — something I visit from time to time or view from behind my windshield.

Nature called today, but it wasn't a long distance call. It came from within, over the intercom. Hey, it said, it's your brother, the lodgepole, your sister, the river, your cousin, the hummingbird.
