

The first few minutes of the meeting we welcomed and received the new members from the recent New Member class. They were Mark and Carolyn Williams, Jeffrey Bissell, and Mike Marjanen. We spent a brief time listening to their journeys to Bozeman and our church.

Donna Beck read a thank you note from the Presby Cats for the congregation's support in their mission trip to Northern Ireland.

Dan and Jody will be traveling May 3-10 to Chicago to be with Alice and Paul as they both graduate with their Masters. Dan Holland will then be preaching May 8 for Camp Sunday.

Spiritual Growth committee will be working to put things together for fall. Feedback is still welcome.

By an approved motion, \$1,760.00 was granted from the Pat Donehoo Fund for the Presby Cats mission trip due to a short fall. The Rent-a-Cat brought in an additional \$450.00 since they returned from the trip.

An initial loan of \$1,500.00 was approved, half from the Fruitfulness Fund for Presby Cats support and half from the Pat Donehoo Fund for youth and collegiate mission trips, to support the application for 20 people on a mission trip to Chicago in March 2017.

Rockhaven Board is focusing on developing a long range plan with the help of Lowell Springer, a well-respected architect who has offered to donate his expertise in helping us get a plan down on paper. We have a record number of registrations at a record early date for the camps. There are waiting lists for most camps. The campership fund is growing, but our campers still need support in this area.

There will be a session retreat in September. Hospitality committee is planning a thank you dinner for the choir on Wednesday, May 11, from 6-7 before their last rehearsal before summer break. There is a big thank you card for everyone to sign and express their thanks to the choir.

We are blessed with the stewardship of Rockhaven, a place where we meet God in simplicity, peacefulness, and faith. As the summer approaches and we prepare for fellowship opportunities, Vespers worship, and summer camp, all are invited to join in prayer and praise for this special place and its ministry.

Rockhaven Summer Camps Report

A record number of registrations, at a record early date, has yielded FULL camps for the season. That's more than 240 camp registrations!

Many campers attend multiple camps, so this number represents approximately 150 different campers. As part of our camp's mission, we provide camperships for those with financial need. The average need for assistance is \$100/camp.

Thanks to the generosity of the congregation, all campership requests will be met. Thank you to the Board of Deacons for a major gift, to the youth of the church who put on the Easter Breakfast in support of the campership fund, and to generous individual donors who have made gifts. The fund now stands at approximately \$4200. Any funds not used this year will provide a boost for next year's fund, helping our camp be available to all children.

Jody let us know that as she is wrapping up the latest requests for assistance, she gets to hear these parents RAVE about the experience their kids had last summer. They beg to go back; some parents testify that their children have been shy but camp really helped them. They say that sending their kids to camp is really good for the parents themselves, and always express how grateful they are for the program and the assistance!

Thank you everyone for all you do for the Kids at Rockhaven.

Find out from Mission Worker, Ruth Brown, on Tuesday, May 24 at 7:00 p.m. in room 204. Ruth will share where some of our money goes when given to One Great Hour of Sharing or the PW Thank offering. Ruth is a mission worker with PCUSA and will be with us for coffee, dessert and fellowship to share her experiences. She says "I simply want to thank churches for their already existing part in PC(USA)'s partnership with the Presbyterian Church of Congo (CPC) and to provide more understanding our work for development in Congo.

When church members have given to Presbyterian Women's Thank Offering and to One Great Hour of Sharing, they have supported communities in Congo! In the past 6 years, the CPC has been a recipient of 4

grants from Presbyterian Women's Thank Offering and 2 grants from Presbyterian Hunger"

Ruth was appointed as a mission co-worker to serve as a development specialist with the leadership of the Presbyterian Community of Congo (CPC) focusing on food security issues. Ruth works with the CPC development staff as they expand existing development services and collaborates closely with ecumenical organizations with similar goals. She trains and accompanies church and community leaders in resolving problems by using local resources. She supports plans and training for community needs assessment and resource mapping, program monitoring, and evaluation. She also collaborates closely with other PC(USA) personnel assigned to the Central and West Africa area.

As a development specialist, Ruth works with communities to address the root causes of hunger and poor health rather than just treat symptoms. She strives to help adults and youth evaluate their situations and develop solutions that will serve the entire community.

Mission Trip to Dakota Presbytery, part 2

Peck reservation in northeastern Montana to build relationships with the Dakota Presbyterian Churches there. Last spring, the group of 13 short term "missionaries" completed the documentation of a cemetery at the Makaicu Presbyterian Church. This year, projects are still developing but the mission of building relationships remains primary.



The trip will take place May 31- June 4 this year. Holland-days...

I don't imagine it is a coincidence that God uses Jewish holidays as a reference point for Christian ones. The best example of this is Easter which overlaps with the Jewish festival of Passover. The second best is rapidly approaching, namely Pentecost Sunday (this year it falls on May 15th.) Pentecost is the Greek word for the Jewish festival of Shavuot, a harvest festival that always occurs fifty days after Passover. I know enough geometry to know that "pent" signifies five (think pentagon) so perhaps "cost" means something akin to "times ten days after Passover." In any event, Christians have squeezed it into the Roman calendar by designating the seventh Sunday after Easter as Pentecost and the time in between as Eastertide.

I don't know about you, but Pentecost usually sneaks up on me. That is to say I normally sit down in my pew on that Sunday morning, open up the bulletin, and notice "oh, that's right; it's Pentecost Sunday." That is regrettable behavior on my part, because Pentecost is a big deal. It is the day God chose to bless the early followers of Christ with the gift of the Holy Spirit, followers who happened to be gathered in one spot because they were celebrating Shavuot.

I am a little more in tune with Pentecost this year, because I have been participating in a Bible study that follows the lectionary. The lectionary always follows the church calendar, and that explains why we typically hear sermons preached from the Book of Acts during Eastertide. It is a purposeful effort to remind us of the struggles and triumphs of the early church. But let's face it, the Book of Acts just doesn't get the notoriety that many other books in the Bible get. I mean Cecil B. DeMille never made a movie called Acts of the Apostles.

I'll be the first to admit that reading Acts can sometimes be tedious for me. But in an effort to make it a tad more relevant, I have taken to doing a little substituting. I hope this isn't a heretical act on my part, but instead of reading Philippi, or Corinth, or Thessalonica, I say Bozeman, or the Gallatin Valley. And instead of reading the apostles, or the followers, or Lydia, or Peter, I say the Board of Deacons, or the Family Promise volunteers, or the hospitality committee. It is a way of breathing fresh air into an ancient text and reminding me that the Holy Spirit is as alive in our congregation as it was in theirs.
